These are traditional symbols used by the American Indians - a horse represents journey; a tepee represents temporary home; the medicine man's eye represents wise, watchful; sun rays represent constancy; crossed arrows represent friendship. Each symbol is embroidered into the photograph of a nearby creek, merging the symbol's meaning with the constant flow of the water to create a metaphorical remedy.
